


Offers many tips and tools including ABC and thematic books, word walls, suggested books, environmental print, book box, text-picture match, using pictures, building sentences, and echo reading. The most helpful tool included with this book is the free CD of printables that is included. Most recommendations are available to print on the provided CD. Focuses on alternate assessment, IEPs, standards, progress monitoring, and using evidence-based practices. Also covers many other subject areas outside of literacy. <p><b>Early Interventions in Reading; SRA</b></p>	<p>Phonics-based, sight words, fluency, and comprehension approach. Designed for grades levels 1-3 and as an intervention for struggling readers. Recommended as supplemental daily program with small groups of 3-5 students. Includes 140 lessons; 40 min. each lesson. Program is designed to bring struggling readers to grade level within one year. Includes error correction, appropriate pace, little talk from teacher, constant exchange between teacher and student, scaffolding, and scope and sequence. <p><b>Early Literacy Skills Builder (ELSB)</b></p>	<p>Combines aspects of decoding, sight words, and comprehension; pre-reading program.</p> <p>Includes visuals, many pictures, frog puppet named Moe, and pictures to describe words (such as with Writing with Symbols program). Program offers suggestions for prompting and adaptations for students with moderate-severe disabilities, including AAC. Big focus on alliteration and rhyming in many lessons; not as much focus on functional words. Scripted lessons. Can be used 1:1 or in small groups. Recommended as intervention program for students with moderate-severe developmental disabilities.</p> <p>Two 30-minute sessions recommended daily.</p> <p>Scope &amp; sequence includes sight words, pointing to text, responding to questions, clapping syllables, ID letter sounds, blending, creating stories. Not recommended as core reading program by FCRR. Reading level K-1<sup>st</sup> grade. Appropriate in 1:1 setting. Alternative for students who have difficulty with phonics approach.</p> <p>Includes positive reinforcement, routine and structure built into lessons, errorless teaching, little need for extensive professional development, organized, materials available for homework, extra reading, and supplemental worksheets. Includes word recognition lessons, matching words and phrases to pictures, worksheets, comprehension questions, stories, has lots of repetition, mastery tests, and materials to track progress and data. Recommended for middle and high school students; especially with autism. Students learn to recognize 400 functional words. Places for words include menus, job, streets, buildings, and grocery store.</p> <p>Price on link provided is \$525.00. Components available at link. Recommended for students who have difficulty learning. Material is presented on disc on computer; adult sits with child and guides/prompts, children answer questions using computer. Grade levels K-5; also students who need support with phonemic awareness.</p> <p>Similar to Corrective Reading Program. Includes scripted lessons delivered by educator, and 1:1 or small group instruction (preferably small group so that students can benefit from modeling from each other). Sounds are taught systematically using visuals including arrows that help with following through the sounds; repetition, modeling. <p><b>Reading Milestones</b></p>	<p>Phonics, fluency, comprehension, vocabulary.</p> <p>Reading levels range from K-4<sup>th</sup> grade. Originally developed for students who are deaf; also recommended for students who have developmental disabilities, ELL, and overall reading difficulties.</p> <p>Age appropriate material, direct instruction, systematic, language gap for syntax and semantics is considered and tackled in this program, as it targets students who are deaf and learning English. Focuses lessons with teacher manual, workbooks, and spelling program. Adaptations included. Also includes oral reading and large emphasis on comprehension- prediction, question/answer, summarizing.</p> <p>Pricing on link provided is \$2100.00 for all 6 levels combo pack.
