

Get a COVID-19 Vaccine

- » **It is safe!**
- » **It works!**
- » Hoosiers over the age of 12 can get a COVID-19 vaccine.
- » It is very important for **people with disabilities** to get a COVID-19 vaccine.
- » It will help protect you, your family, and those you care about!
- » After a lot of people get the vaccines, we can go back to our activities and start seeing people again.

How to get a vaccine

- » You can get the vaccine at many places. These places are community vaccination clinics, your local hospital, and pharmacies (CVS, Meijer, Kroger, Walgreens, and others).
- » Go to ourshot.in.gov or call 2-1-1 to make a vaccine appointment.
- » You need your name and birthday to make an appointment.
- » Have identification when you go to your appointment.
- » You can have someone come with you to your appointment.
- » If you have a guardian or you are under 18, bring your guardian with you.
- » Three types of COVID-19 vaccines are available now. The Moderna and Pfizer vaccines require two shots. The Johnson & Johnson requires one.
- » Most vaccines need 2 shots to work. Make sure you get both shots. You get the second shot 3 to 4 weeks after you got the first one.
- » At your appointment you will get a card. The card tells what COVID-19 vaccine you got. Keep your card in a safe place.
