Changes to My Medicaid Insurance



My Medicaid insurance paid for a lot of medical treatment during the last few years because of the COVID-19 pandemic. COVID-19 is still a problem, but it is not called a national emergency anymore. So, I need to know about some changes to what my insurance will pay for.



I can still get a COVID-19 vaccine for free, but now I might have to pay for a COVID-19 test.

I can still see my doctor using telehealth on my smartphone or computer, but I might have to go to my doctor's office to get some of my medication prescriptions.



I might get some Medicaid paperwork in the mail. If I get something called a Medicaid renewal form, I should fill it out right away and mail it back.

It is important for me to do this so I can continue to get my Medicaid health insurance. It is very important to make sure that I have all of my paperwork for my Medicaid filled out and turned in, including my address, phone number, and email address.



If I have questions or need help, I should ask a trusted person, such as a caregiver or my doctor. It is good to know what my Medicaid insurance will pay for and what I will have to pay for with my own money.
