CURRENT RESEARCH:

Title of Grant: Sexuality Education for Students with Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities: Teachers' Perceptions and Current Practice.

- My Position: Project Coordinator
- Grant Received July, 2018
- Purpose of Research: The purpose of this study are to 1) examine the perceptions of educators in Indiana regarding teaching sexuality education to their students with disabilities and 2) examine practices implemented in their school regarding the delivery of sexuality education to students with disabilities. Regarding the teachers' perceptions, this study will examine the followings: a) their beliefs in the need for sexuality education for students with disabilities; b) their comfort in teaching sexuality education to students with disabilities; c) their professional preparation for sexuality education to students with disabilities; and d) their needs for and barriers to the provision of sexuality education to students with disabilities.

Title of Grant: Improving Sexual Health for Hoosiers with Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities

- My Position: Research Associate
- Grant Received: October, 2018
- Purpose of Research: This project aims to improve health and well-being of Hoosiers with disabilities by enhancing sexual health literacy and advocacy skills for adult women with IDD and their partners through the development of evidence-based sexual health education in an accessible format. To this end, the project will determine the needs of sexual health of Hoosier adults with IDD through literature review, key informant interviews, and focus groups. This will help identify the current landscape of sexual health for adult women with IDD and their partners in Indiana. This understanding will lay the foundation for addressing the issue based on evidence and guiding future efforts. This project is funded by the Indiana Governor's Council for People with Disabilities (GCPD).
