



The Discovery Process

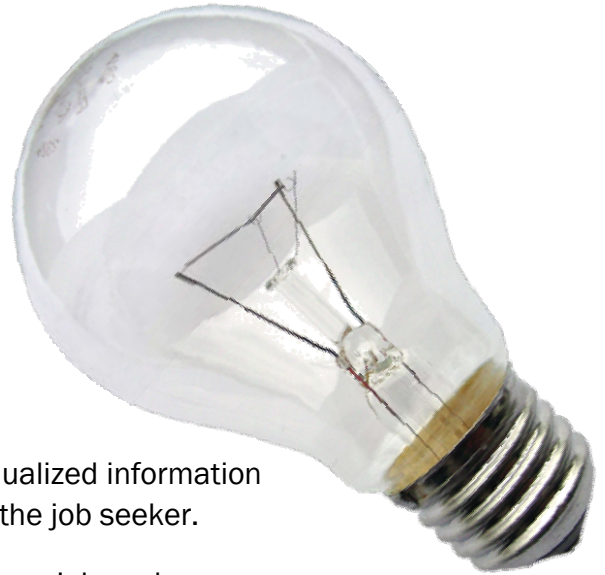
A two-day, in-depth training for employment service professionals learning to build a customized foundation for employment and career planning

Audience: Employment Specialists, Job Coaches, Job Developers and Program Managers

This training will help you learn about Discovery, an individualized information gathering process that will guide employment services for the job seeker.

During training, you'll find out how Discovery activities engage job seekers and invest them in the process. Plus, you'll learn how Discovery enables you and your job seeker to obtain accurate and useful information—the groundwork you'll use to build, develop, and implement a person-centered employment plan. Training participants will:

- Become familiar with the Discovery process
- Develop the basic skills to begin providing Discovery services
- Develop the skills to document Discovery activities using Indiana's Discovery Profile to guide the employment process

Bob Niemiec, M.Ed., is a senior consultant with Griffin-Hammis Associates, LLC, and serves as the director of the

Minnesota Employment Training and Technical Assistance Center. Prior to that, Bob was the director of employment and community supports for Community Involvement Programs in Minneapolis, where he led the transformation of a traditional day program into a high quality community employment service. Bob has provided training and consultation services in 44 states and two Canadian provinces, and he assisted in the planning and

facilitation of Employment First events in 12 states. In these roles, Bob worked with community rehabilitation programs to increase integrated employment outcomes for people with disabilities and to help manage organizational change efforts. A graduate of Indiana University, Bob has been in the field of employment for persons with disabilities for over thirty-four years. Bob is a past-president of APSE: The Association of People Supporting Employment First, a founding member and former president of Minnesota APSE, former president of the APSE Foundation, a current member of the editorial board of *The Journal of Vocational Rehabilitation*, and a founding member of the Minnesota Employment First Coalition.



Patty Cassidy, M.Ed., is a senior associate with Griffin-Hammis Associates, LLC,

providing training and technical assistance on employment to projects and agencies so they can create better employment outcomes for people with significant disabilities. Patty is a former employment specialist, working with adults and transition-aged youth

through the School-to-Work Alliance Program in Colorado; she was director of supported employment for community rehabilitation programs in Virginia, Indiana, and Colorado, responsible for managing, recruiting, and training employment staff, and the funding collaboration and fiscal management of large community employment programs. Patty is an approved trainer for the Association of Community Rehabilitation Educators (ACRE) customized employment curriculum.
